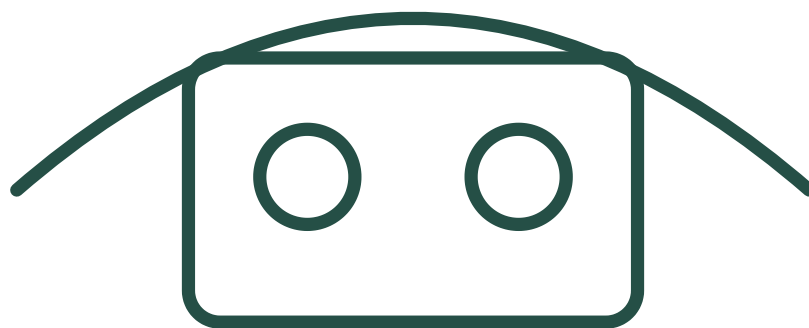

Cultural Traditions

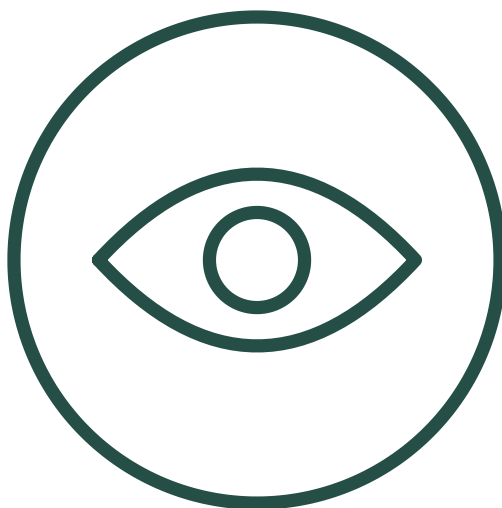

Special Moments

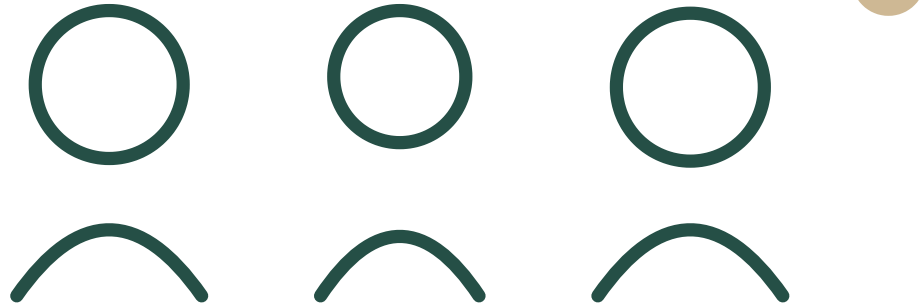
